Jamie Reid (born April 10, 1941) is a Canadian poet. He was born in Timmins, Ontario. Reid co-founded the influential poetry newsletter TISH in Vancouver in 1961 with George Bowering, Frank Davey and Fred Wah. He published his first collection of poems, *The Man Whose Path Was on Fire*, in 1969. A short time later he dedicated himself to communist organizing in Ontario, and ceased publishing. Reid returned to print in 1994 with *Prez: Homage to Lester Young*, a verse-biography of the famed jazz saxophonist. He currently publishes *DaDaBaBy*, a journal and chapbook press.
