More than 2,200 students are eligible to take part in one of four convocation ceremonies this week at Simon Fraser University's Burnaby campus – the stories about a few of our graduands are highlighted below.

In addition, honorary degrees will be conferred on three distinguished individuals, including:

- Martha Nussbaum, renowned American philosopher and faculty member at the University of Chicago (Thursday's 2:30 pm ceremony)
- A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, former president of India (Friday's 9:45 a.m. ceremony)
- Kim Baird, former chief of the Tsawwassen First Nation (Friday's 2:30 p.m. ceremony)

Each will participate in the graduands' procession across the AQ pond and down the stairs into Convocation Mall, and seated on stage. The conferring of honorary degrees follows brief welcome addresses by Chancellor Carole Taylor and President Andrew Petter. The honorary degree recipients also give a speech.
