Discussion Topics: CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

This is primarily a course in the fundamentals of directing, leading to public performance of student-directed projects. The students are expected to integrate and implement the techniques acquired in the earlier studios. (Seminar/Studio)

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

Through weekly readings, discussions, and in-class exercises, students will explore issues and skills in theatre direction: play selection, text-analysis, staging & design, auditions & casting, rehearsal strategies, as well as communication with actors and the production team. Students will write a brief paper, and present an oral report, on the distinct theatrical "vision" of a director (or playwright). As a culmination to the course, each student will select and direct a brief one-act play for public performance; students also will provide support for the presentation of their classmate\202s projects. Finally, students will document, and reflect upon, their process in a directing journal.
