It will emphasize the contributions of studies of material culture to our understandings of social, economic, religious, and political activities and their changes over time. While not a Classics, History, nor an Art History course, this course will make use of ancient texts, art, and architecture to provide background information and to supplement that information provided by the archaeological record.
