EDUCATION SEMINAR

Dr. A. R. MacKinnon, Dean of Education, has recently returned from Ottawa where he attended an invitational seminar on Foundations for the Future-Teacher Education and Certification, sponsored by the Canadian Teachers' Federation.

The purpose of the conference was primarily to review teacher education programs across Canada and to see if some measure of consensus might be obtained. The conference revealed a striking diversity of programs and a multitude of problems in the transfer of students from one province to another.

Approximately 100 delegates attended the seminar representing provincial teachers' associations, teacher educators, trustees and departments of education.

ORIGINAL DRAMA

Mr. Michael Bawtree, University Lecturer in Theatre Arts with the Communications Centre, has been offered the unique opportunity of writing an original play for this summer's Stratford Shakespearian Festival in Ontario.
