NEW APPOINTMENTS

Dr. P. D. McTaggart-Cowan, President, Simon Fraser University, announces the appointment of Mr. Dennis Roberts as Information Officer.

Mr. Roberts, presently Director of Public Relations, United Community Service (formerly Community Chest and Councils) will assume his position at Simon Fraser University on August 8 of this year.

Following his war service as a Radio Officer with the British Merchant Navy, Mr. Roberts worked in England as a newspaperman for the Evening Standard, London. Immediately prior to joining the Community Chest staff in 1958, he served as Copy Editor of the Vancouver Province.

In addition to his media and public relations work, Mr. Roberts is a successful novelist and playwright. His first book "I'll Climb Mount Everest Alone," published in 1957, was later adapted for radio by the B.B.C. Recently one of his plays was produced by the Vancouver Theatre Guild for CHAN-TV Workshop 30.

Dr. Parzival Copes, Department Head, has announced that Dr. Sydney H. Coontz has taken up his post as Associate Professor in the Department of Economics and Commerce.

Dr. Coontz received his B.A. degree from the University of Washington. His graduate studies were pursued at the University of California in Berkeley, where he obtained his M.A. degree at the London School of Economics and Political Science, from which he received his Ph.D. degree.

Just prior to his appointment at Simon Fraser, Dr. Coontz held the post of Associate Professor at the University of Utah. His wide teaching experience also included posts at Idaho State College, San Diego State College and New York State College of Forestry. He served as Visiting Lecturer at the University of Ghana.

The major areas of Dr. Coontz's academic interest are economic history, the history of economic thought and population economics. His book, Population Theories and the Economic Interpretation, published in 1957, translated into Spanish in 1960, and reprinted in 1961, investigated the relationship of population increases and decreases to the demand for labor. In 1959 Dr. Coontz presented a paper, "The Economics of High Fertility in Densely Populated Underdeveloped Areas", to the World Population Congress in Vienna. His most recent book, Productive Labor and Effective Demand, Including a Critique of Keynesian Economics, was released early in 1966.
