NEW SCHOLARSHIP & BURSARY ESTABLISHED

Simon Fraser University takes pleasure in announcing the Plimsoll Club of Vancouver bursary, and the Dr. Wickham and Dr. Mitchell Clinic scholarship.

The \$500 Plimsoll Club bursary will be awarded to a student majoring in commerce or economics, commencing in the Fall semester. Eligibility will be dependent on merit and financial need. The award will be divided into two equal amounts of \$250, with the second part being awarded in the following semester.

The Dr. Wickham and Dr. Mitchell Clinic scholarship of \$200 is offered to students proceeding from Grade XII at Ladysmith Secondary School to a full program of studies at the University of British Columbia, the University of Victoria, or Simon Fraser University. The winner will be selected by the scholarship committee of the school on the basis of academic standing, and interest and participation in school affairs.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION CONFERENCE

Dr. A. R. MacKinnon, Dean of the Faculty of Education, has been invited by His Excellency Mr. W. Walton Butterworth, Ambassador of the United States, to visit Washington under the auspices of the United States Department of State. The purpose of the trip will be to provide a week of consultations and briefings which will give some insight into the workings of governmental and policy-making machinery at the national level.
