CANADA COUNCIL AWARD

A Canada Council grant of \$1,500 has been awarded to Dr. A. B. Cunningham, Head of the Department of History and Dean of Arts at Simon Fraser University.

The award will enable Dr. Cunningham to complete a biography of Stratford de Redcliffe, one of the most controversial personalities in the history of diplomacy.

Stratford's private correspondence alone fills over 370 large boxes and his public correspondence with governments and rulers is bound in over 1,000 volumes.

The Canada Council award will help purchase the material required for the last two chapters of the biography.

PUBLICATION

Dr. Stanley Cooperman, Department of English, will have his first volume of poetry The Day of the Parrot, published by the University of Nebraska Press in late 1967. This volume will be available in paperback and hard cover. A second volume of poetry called The Owl Behind the Door will be published shortly thereafter.
