Biographical sketch:

Michael Turner was born in North Vancouver, Canada, in 1962, and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts (anthropology) from the University of Victoria in 1986. From 1987-1993, he played in the popular Vancouver busking band Hard Rock Miners. His published fiction and poetry include: Company Town, Hard Core Logo, Kingsway, American Whiskey Bar, and The Pornographer's Poem. His work has been adapted to radio, stage, television and feature-film, is widely translated, and has appeared in numerous anthologies including The Notebooks, Story of a Nation, and Lost Classics. His awards include the 2000 BC Book Prize for Fiction and a 1996 Genie Award for Music/Original Song. He was also a finalist for the 1992 Dorothy Livesay BC Book Prize for Poetry. Turner has collaborated with artist Stan Douglas on two screenplays for DV installation/TV broadcast: Journey Into Fear (Istanbul Biennial) and Suspiria (Documenta XI). Additionally, he worked with filmmaker Bruce LaBruce on the screenplay Untitled Von Gloeden Project, based on the life and work of photographer Wilhelm Von Gloeden. He completed a libretto commissioned by the Modern Baroque Opera Company, based on Wilhelm Busch's Max & Mortiz. His essay on Vancouver's commercial galleries appears in the Arsenal Pulp Press/Artspeak anthology Vancouver Art & Economies. Finally, Turner has contributed numerous articles on literature and visual art to major journals and newspapers. Turner still lives in Vancouver, where he is active in the writing and visual art scenes and the promotion and organization of local and national events. Representative of his combined interest in music and writing, he founded well-known literary and music showcases such as the Reading Railroad (1993-1996) at the Railway Club and the Malcolm Lowry Room (1994-1997).

Scope and content:

Collection contains drafts of manuscripts of poetry, essays and articles, short fiction, scripts, and novels, originals and reproductions of publications in which Turner's and other authors' works have

appeared; clippings of reviews and articles about Turner and his published works; and other records and ephemera related to Turner's writing, editing, and publishing activities and projects. It also contains photographs, notes, clippings, correspondence, audio and digital recordings, ephemera and press materials related to Turner's musicianship, including his stint in the Hard Rock Miners. The collection is arranged in seven series: Music; Writing; Publishing, editing, and consulting; Teaching; Acting; Event promotion, management, and judging; and Correspondence.

Source of title proper:

Title based on provenance.

Immediate source of acquisition:

Acquired by Simon Fraser University Special Collections and Rare Books Division from Michael Turner in 2008.

Arrangement:

The files are arranged physically by accession, based on Turner's own arrangement of the records. Wherever possible, files have remained as they were when they were acquired. In some circumstances where chronological ordering would facilitate access, order has been imposed where there was none upon acquisition. For instance, files consisting of photocopied press clippings or correspondence have been rearranged to reflect rough chronological order. Some large files have been separated into components to ensure proper storage. Because of the efforts to maintain original order wherever possible, some press clippings, correspondence, and other materials related to one series may be located within another series to which they also belong. For this reason, the researcher would do well to search in the work or project series as well as the general series containing materials of the sort they are seeking. For instance, Sub-series 2.2. Hard Core Logo (Arsenal Pulp, 1993) materials may also be located in Sub-series 2.8. Miscellaneous press, correspondence, readings, and promotions.

Language:

English with some French language materials.

Terms governing use and reproduction:

Reproduction of the material is subject to the approval of the Special Collections and Rare Books librarian.

Finding aids:

Series descriptions, box and folder lists are available.

Associated material:

Simon Fraser Library holds circulating copies of *American Whisky Bar: a novel, Company Town, Hard Core Logo*, and *Pornographer's Poem: a novel*.

Accruals:

Further accruals expected.

Conservation:

Staples, paperclips, and other metal has been removed and items that were grouped together with such bindings have been placed between archival paper to signify that original grouping. Archival quality paper has also been interleaved when necessary to separate acidic paper from surrounding materials. Duplicates have been disposed of wherever necessary. Newspaper clippings have been photocopied onto archival quality paper and sometimes reduced in size. Adhesive post-it notes throughout have not been removed because of their quantity and the lack of any acceptable replacement. Oversized items were removed and placed in Box 14, but they are still intellectually grouped within the appropriate series.

Series descriptions

Series 1. Music.

Dates: 1979-1993.

Extent: 10.4 cm of textual records.

Scope and content: Series contains materials related to Michael Turner's musical undertakings, both as a solo performer and as a founding member of the Hard Rock Miners. The sub-series include: 1.1 Hard Rock Miners

and 1.2 Other music.

Sub-series 1.1. Hard Rock Miners.

Dates: 1989-1993.

Extent: 9 cm of textual records, photographs, and ephemera.

Notes: Sub-series includes a speeding ticket with a photograph from that period that M. Turner considers a "portrait" of him with his then-girlfriend. As well, in an e-mail exchange between Turner and the archivist that can be found in Series 7, Turner indicated that a packet of sweet corn that was found in the materials was purchased at a gas station while the Hard Rock Miner's were on their first tour in 1988, just after they were almost hit head on by a semi truck near Vegreville. For the next five years of touring, Turner kept it in his banjo case, "underneath a stack of Ernie Ball strings," as a good luck charm.

Sub-series 1.2. Other music.

Dates: 1979-1994.

Extent: 1.4 cm of drawings.

Notes: In an e-mail exchange between Turner and the archivist that can be found in Series 7, Turner indicated that the sketchbook in this series includes mostly drawings intended as gig posters, album art, song illustrations and inspiration for his band "The Saving Grace" in Victoria during his university days. The very first drawing, however, is from around 1979 and is of Turner's first family dog, Chester, when he was in grade 11 or 12. Also according to Turner, the "cubist work of the recurring woman was by

then-girlfriend and bandmate Ingrid Percy". Most sketches and text date between 1981-1986, when

Michael was at the University of Victoria, but the last ones are circa 1994.

Series 2. Writing.

Dates: 1991-2003.

Extent: 79.4 cm of textual materials.

Scope and content: Series contains materials related to each book that Turner has written thus far. Each book sub-series includes manuscripts, related press, and correspondence. Series also contains the same types of materials for other writing, such as anthologies, collaborative efforts, scripts, and journalistic reviews. General press about Turner's writing that is not related to a particular work is grouped within its own sub-series along

with general correspondence, materials related to readings, and other promotional materials. Sub-series include:

2.1 Company Town, 2.2 Hard Core Logo, 2.3 Kingsway, 2.4 American Whisky Bar, 2.5 Pornographer's Poem,

Extent: 4.7 cm textual records.

Scope and content: Materials related to Company Town (Arsenal Pulp, 1991).

Sub-series 2.2. Hard Core Logo.

Dates: 1993-1996.

Extent: 20 cm textual records.

Scope and content: Materials related to *Hard Core Logo* (Arsenal Pulp, 1993).

Conservation: Much of the paper included in the first draft was of poor quality, so it is artificially separated

out from other, better quality paper with interleaving.

Sub-series 2.3. Kingsway.

Dates: 1995-1996.

Extent: 1.7 cm textual records.

Scope and content: Materials related to Kingsway (Arsenal Pulp, 1995).

Sub-series 2.4. American Whiskey Bar.

Dates: 1997-1999.

Extent: 1.8 cm textual records.

Scope and content: Materials related to American Whiskey Bar (Arsenal Pulp, 1997).

Sub-series 2.5. Pornographer's Poem.

Dates: 1997-2000

Extent: 12 cm textual records.

Scope and content: Materials related to *Pornographer's Poem* (Doubleday Canada, 1999).

Sub-series 2.6. Anthologies, collaborations and scripts.

Dates: 1970, 1990, predominantly 1997-2002.

Extent: 38.4 cm textual records, 1 monograph, and a VHS tape.

Scope and content: Materials related to *Survivial* (Arsenal Pulp Press, 1997) *Billy the Kid* / Michael Turner (screenplay, 1998), *Suspiria* / Michael Turner and Bruce MacDonald (screenplay, 2002), *Journey into Fear* / Stan Douglas and Michael Turner (screenplay, 2002), (screenplay, 2002), *Von Gloeden* / Michael Turner and Bruce LaBruce (screenplay, 2002), *Max & Moritz* / Jeff Corness and Michael Turner (libretto, 2002), and other collaborative works.

Sub-series 2.7. Articles and reviews.

Dates: 1997-2006.

Extent: .5 cm textual records.

Scope and content: Materials related to articles and reviews by Turner for newspapers and periodicals.

Sub-series 2.8. Miscellaneous press, correspondence, readings, and promotions.

Dates: 1987-2000.

Extent: .3 cm textual records and 2 photographs.

Scope and content: Press, correspondence, readings, and promotional materials related to Turner's writing in general.

Series 3. Publishing, editing, and consulting.

Dates: 1992-2004.

Extent: 18.28 cm textual materials and monographs.

Scope and content: Series contains materials related to Advance Editions, the imprint of Arsenal Pulp Press that Turner headed, as well as manuscripts by other authors that Turner reviewed either for the imprint or for editing or consulting purposes. The sub-series include: 3.1 Advance Editions: Arsenal Pulp Press (imprint) and 3.2 Manuscripts by other authors.

Sub-series 3.1. Advance Editions: Arsenal Pulp Press (imprint).

Dates: 1999-2004.

Extent: 1.78 cm textual materials and 3 monographs.

Sub-series 3.2. Manuscripts by other authors.

Dates: 1992-1999.

Extent: 16.5 cm textual materials.

Series 4. Teaching.

Dates: 2001.

Extent: .6 cm textual materials.

Scope and content: Series contains materials related to Turner's professional teaching activities.

Sub-series 4.1. Capilano College Course (Spring 2001).

Dates: 2001.

Extent: .6 cm textual materials.

Scope and content: Consists of materials created or accumulated while Turner instructed TCRI 301 in the Writing Practices Program at Capilano College.

Series 5. Acting.

Dates: 1996.

Extent: .7 cm textual materials.

Scope and content: Series contains materials related to Turner's acting activities.

Sub-series 5.1. Elimination Dance / by Michael Ondaatje, Bruce McDonald, and Don McKellar.

Dates: 1996.

Extent: .7 cm textual materials.

Scope and content: Contains materials related to Turner's role in Elimination Dance.

Notes: Turner played "Caller" (August 1996). The script, call sheets, and shooting schedule were found together in a large yellow envelope with "Elimination Dance" in red on the outside but no other markings. The folder was disposed of for preservation purposes.

Series 6. Event promotion, management and judging.

Dates: 1993-1996.

Extent: 45 cm textual records and other materials.

Scope and content: Series contains materials related to Turner's event promotion, management and judging.

The sub-series include: 6.1 Reading Railroad, 6.2 Malcolm Lowry Room, and 6.3 Events and Readings.

Sub-series 6.1. Reading Railroad.

Dates: January 1993-May 1995.

Extent: 31.7 cm textual records, 1 photograph and digital audio tapes.

Scope and content: Sub-series consists of press clippings, correspondence, live recordings and ephemera related to the Reading Railroad series at the Railway Club. Reading Railroad was a reading and music series that occurred on the third Monday of each month at the Railway Club. An alternative literary venue for Vancouver, the event paired new authors with more well-known authors. Three or more authors read for twenty to twenty-five minutes followed by a short set by a musician. Over the course of two years, it featured over 120 emerging and established writers and singer-songwriters from North America and abroad.

Sub-series 6.2. Malcolm Lowry Room.

Dates: September 1993-March 1996.

Extent: 7.4 cm textual records, photographs, audio cassette tapes and digital audio tapes.

Scope and content: Sub-series consists of press clippings, financial records, promotional materials,

photographs, live records and ephemera from the Malcolm Lowry Room.

Related materials: E-mails between the archivist and Turner regarding the founding of the Malcolm Lowry Room can be found in Series 7.

Sub-series 6.3. Events and readings.

Dates: 1991-1994.

Extent: 5.9 cm of textual records and photographs.

Scope and content: Sub-series contains materials related to events and readings that Michael Turner organized or promoted but which were not associated with the Reading Railroad or the Malcolm Lowry Room.

Related materials: E-mails between the archivist and Turner regarding some of the events in this Series can be found in Series 7.

Series 7. Correspondence.

Dates: 1983-2008.

Extent: 12.7 cm of textual records.

Scope and content: Series consists of correspondence to and from Turner.
